Where community benefit funds are offered, recipients typically receive either a single lump sum, or yearly payments. Recipients have included established community groups or councils, community centres and wildlife groups.

Bolsovermoor Quarry Solar Farm, Old Bolsover Town Council, UK

- Community defibrillator in a disused phonebox
- New play equipment and area in the local park
- A Christmas tree provided to the village each year, decorated by the local community

Fields Farm Solar Farm, Tushingham, Macefen & Bradley Parish Meeting, UK

- New "daily mile" running track installed at the local school
- Improved access to local church
- Funding 'Operation Shield', for every home in the Parish to have a security marking kit for their property to deter theft

Parsonage Wood Solar Farm, Pyworthy Parish Council, UK

- Maintenance, new play equipment and safety fencing for the local park
- Repairs to heating and electrics in the local church
- Major refurbishments to the Village Hall

Shaftesbury Solar Farm, Donhead St Mary Parish Council, UK

- New solar panels for the local school
- A defibrillator installed in the community
- Speed indicator device installed
- Trees planted to commemorate the centenary of the end of the First World War
- Improvements to the local playground

Trevemper Solar Farm, Cubert Parish Council, UK

- New solar panels, ceiling and heating system for the Village Hall
- Roof repairs at the local church and Memorial Hall
- Materials and memory aids for the local Memory Café
- Repairs and sea defences for the local Surf Life Saving Clubs
- Two new defibrillators for the community
- Equipment for the Silver Surfer internet club
- Provision of a sustainable water supply for the allotment society

Upper Clayhill Solar Farm, Barcombe Parish Council, UK

- Improvements to local cricket facilities
- Equipment for the local horticultural club
- Funding for a toddler group
