

# West Mokoan solar farm – social licence commitments

We're sharing the benefits of our West Mokoan solar farm with the community. This is a key component of being a good neighbour and responsible developer and will provide significant and meaningful benefits to the community.

## We're offering the following shared community benefits:

The project will deliver a total of \$1,920,000 in community benefits over its project lifespan (40 years) on the following:

- A Construction Community Benefit programme which will distribute \$120,000 at the commencement of the project's construction towards local initiatives that will benefit the community.
- An Operational Community Benefit programme that will distribute \$45,000 per annum for 40 years towards from the start of the project's operational phase for local initiatives. The total value of this commitment is \$1,800,000.

We will also be committing the following benefits:

- Providing \$10,000 per annum for 10 years to the Clontarf Foundation to support holistic educational, employment and social programmes for young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men. The total value of this commitment is \$100,000.
- Contributing \$50,000 per annum for 40 years to the Odonata Foundation to assist in conservation efforts associated with the Winton Wetlands. The total value of this commitment is \$2,000,000.

## Supporting local employment and using local and Australian suppliers

We've also committed to several **local sourcing targets**. This means that we'll be looking to local businesses in the area to support the project as much as we can.

These targets are:

- \$724,006,563.20 committed to local content (in real terms), ensuring that local businesses benefit from procurement opportunities during the development phase. This will be comprised of at least \$284,758,309 during the construction phase and \$439,248,254.20 over 40 years during the

operational phase of the project. (The total project value and the percentage comparison of this commitment has been withheld due to commercial sensitivities).

We've made **commitments to local employment**. This means that we'll be looking to local people and businesses in the area to support the project as much as we can.

- Throughout the construction phases of the project, we have committed to supporting learning workers, and we are investing in education and skills development. This will mean that about 15% of our total workforce will be learning workers.
- We're also committing \$50,000 per annum for 10 years to TAFE Victoria to provide resources for trades courses in rural communities. The total value of this commitment is \$500,000.

#### **First Nations people and business commitments**

- During the construction phase of the project, we have committed to ensuring that 1.5% of the Total Workforce are First Nations workers.
